



Joel Morgovsky, is a retired Professor of Psychology from Brookdale Community College in Lincroft, NJ.

Joel is the Founder of Photopsychology: The Psychology of Photography, which includes Reading Pictures, his systematic approach to discovering the psyche of photographers from their pictures.

Joel is a member of the Soho Photo Gallery in New York City and Chairman of the Soho Photo Annual National Competition. In addition, he serves on the jury of the Annual Soho Photo Gallery International Portfolio Competition, the B&H Portfolio Development Workshops, and provides individual critiques as part of Soho Photo's non-member portfolio reviews.

He has been an exhibiting photographer in black-and-white, darkroom color and digital since 1977. His next exhibition at Soho Photo Gallery will be "From Cuba" during January 2020. Previously he exhibited "Kansas Idyll" a study of rural communities in northeastern Kansas.

He is a frequent lecturer and judge at camera clubs throughout the tri-state region and is on the speaker's list of the New Jersey Federation of Camera Clubs. Joel also offers workshops on the Psychology of Photography including lessons on editing, evaluating, and critiquing a wide range of contemporary photographic styles including one's own body of work. He is also preparing a new project to provide individual photographic mentoring beginning next year.
