Our esteemed judge, **Arik Gorban**, had some exceedingly difficult choices to make in paring down the submissions from 219 entries to 100 accepted works, and has fashioned a show that is second to none. Make an effort to come to EyeSights which is on display until March 29th. You will not be disappointed.

We are thrilled that **Arik Gorban** will deliver a workshop for photographers on Sunday, May 7th, from 1:00 to 5:00, titled **Visualization and Photo Critique.** Enrollment is limited so register early. Details appear in this issue of the Bulletin.

April showers may bring flowers, but April also brings our student shows:

Rumson Fair Haven High School Show: March 31st until April 18th, reception Friday, March 31st from 6:00-8:00 PM **Red Bank Regional High School Show**: April 20th until May 3rd, reception Friday, April 21st from 6:00-8:00 PM.

Through the years, the high school art students in the programs from Rumson Fair Haven Regional and Red Bank Regional have produced outstanding exhibits at the Guild that combine originality and creativity with technical virtuosity. These talented young people offer a look inside their artistic mind and remind us that art represents the artist's view of the world in which we all inhabit. You will be fascinated with their skill, ingenuity, and boundless imagination.

April also brings a new Exhibiting and Associate Members' Lobby Show. While we are accustomed to the wealth of talent seen in our lobby shows, each month seems to bring even better artwork. There is a lot to see at the Guild this time of year. We hope you get a chance to stop by.

With the final walk-through and payment made just this week to **Michael Kelly** of Kelly Builders and Developers, we close a long running project. The extensive renovation of our studio, financed by a grant from the New Jersey State Council on the Arts, is now officially completed. Supply line issues, subcontractors juggling three jobs, and escalating prices delayed the process, but our project director, Mark Rostek, and all who contributed, resulted in a studio in which we all can be proud. From our gleaming new floor, to the thoughtfully designed cabinets and closets, the brilliant new lighting, a new sink, and all the flourishes, our studio has been transformed into a state of the art sanctuary ready for artists to gather and create artwork. Students and teachers in our classes will enjoy the fruits of so many labors...from the planning by staff and volunteers, to those workers in the trenches, to students and teachers who were inconvenienced at times; we again express our appreciation for your understanding. Thanks to all. The end result really is a dream come true!

A few reminders: **Pratima Rao** returns for two, full day workshops on May 19th and May 26th. Pratima titles the workshops: **Capturing the Essence of the Landscape**. Pratima is an accomplished Plein Air artist and instructor. Information is in this bulletin.

The Art Student Scholarship, awarded by the Guild of Creative Art and the James T. Gary Foundation will be awarded to a graduating high school senior in Monmouth County who plans to major in the visual arts in an accredited college or art school in the fall of 2023. 

Visualization and Photo Critique – A Workshop by Renowned Photographer and EyeSights 2023 Judge

Arik Gorban

Sunday, May 7, 2023, 1:00 to 5:00 at the Guild of Creative Art

Explore unique and exciting photo opportunities around your home or while traveling. Our workshop begins with a discussion about creative seeing and understanding how to make engaging, interesting, and personally-expressive photographs. We discuss visualization and the key considerations when planning and making photographs.

An interactive photo critique session is next on our agenda. Students will review and critique a collection of images.

Hands-on practice is next, photographing table-top setups and portraits. You will learn to focus on creating interesting photographs about the subjects, not just accurate recordings. We explore visual ideas and various tools and techniques that allow us to craft unique images.

Our objective is for you to learn to see creatively and make more meaningful photographs, while developing the tools to evaluate your own work and the work of other photographers. I will provide you with tools, not rules, for making better photographs. Conformity to rules often inhibits creativity and the development of a personal style. Your own vision and style are important.

During the photo shoot, you'll have the opportunity to photograph tabletop setups and portraits. I recommend that you bring a camera and lens combination that allows for close-up photography and exposure control. A tripod and an off-camera lighting gear (flash or LED light) will also be useful. A smart phone is also acceptable.

Gold Award for Best in Show – Color: John Mottola for *Street Painter*

Judge's comment: Creative and beautifully handled picture of the street painter. The capture is wonderful, but the post processing made it a unique and engaging picture. The square format works well. The textures isolate the subject from any distracting elements. Only supporting elements are kept in the frame.



Gold Award for Best in Show – Monochrome: Jessica Margo for *My Feathered Friends*

Judges comment: Excellent street picture in b&w. The technical aspects of compositions are all handled well, but it's the subject that is unique, interesting, and engaging. While not directly looking at the camera, his expression shows his emotional connection to the birds. The other birds also add interest to the picture.

Alice Tendler Memorial Award for Artistic Innovation – Robin Stevens for A Walk in the Rain Judge's comment: High visual impact with contrasting colors. Beautiful work with the motion effect to create a unique story-telling abstract.



Bob Warwick Memorial Award for Pet Photo: Lilia Maloratskiy for *Curiosity Venice Italy*Judge's comment: This is a fantastic street photo that works so well because of the cat in the window.

While it is not a photo of a cat, the inclusion of the cat in the frame was essential to the success of the picture.



H. Jeffrey Leonard Memorial Award for Action Photograph:
Melinda Campione for *Forest Fire Girl*

Judge's comment: Strong story-telling picture of the girl running in the woods. We only see the back of the girl, so the action is the story. This pictured is handled very well.



Al Goldstein Memorial Award for Landscape: Chris Truhe for Vastness of Nature, Smallness of Us Judge's comment: The title says it all, but the impact is in the incredible landscape photo. The maker composed it carefully to include the near landscape, the far mountains, and the dramatic clouds.



Lorraine Ravner Memorial Award for Artistic Photograph: Marino Cirillo for *Blue Broom Group Judge's comment: Very creative work with brooms. The light and shadow play and the unique color cast made it stand out.*



Patrick Sweeney Memorial Award for Architectural Photograph: Cheryl Bomba for *Only the Light Can Enter*

Judge's comment: Excellent work with this old structure. The light, colors, textures and shapes are handled well. Nicely composed and processed picture.




Bob Grunke Memorial Award for Street Photograph (Urban): Rich Despins for Yes, This is the Place Judge's comment: Street photographs are often challenging with difficult light and too many objects in the background. Here, the maker made a beautiful picture that tells a story, but is also moody and has no distractions. The b&w tones are perfect.



Jane Fitzgerald Award for Abstract Photograph: Vicki DeVico for A Splash of Spring


Judge's comment: Colorful, interesting work with flowers. The painterly effect works well for this image.




The maker handled all of the technical aspects well and created an interesting picture of this creature.
