As we enter June, there are so many good things to report. Our **All Member Garden Theme Show** was a feast for the eyes. It started with 110 submissions, an all-time high. Add to this the 107 attendees to the reception, and you get a sense of how significant this show has become. Although a themed show narrows choices for artists, the diversity of styles, the technical brilliance, and the imaginative and provocative leaps some artists took were gratifying. This year's show was simply the strongest Garden Show in recent memory. Samples of the artwork appearing in the Garden Show appear in this Bulletin.

We have surpassed our benchmark of 300 members for membership year 2023, and those numbers continue to grow. We thank all who have joined the Guild, as well as those who have renewed their membership. If you have not renewed your membership for 2023, please click HERE to renew online. Membership dues are such an important revenue stream for us. Dues revenue provides funds to pay our ever-present and increasing bills.

At our **May Portfolio Review**, eleven artists submitted artwork for consideration of advanced membership levels at the Guild. One artist achieved Associate Member status, and nine artists were elevated to Exhibiting Member, the Guild's top membership tier. The range of styles and mediums was truly impressive. The portfolio committee was delighted with the quality and diversity of the submissions. The next Portfolio Review is in November.

If you have never seen a **Paul Hansen** exhibit, you are in for a treat during the month of June. Paul will be joined by **Michael Indorato** to present an array of three layered paintings that were done jointly in a truly innovative and revolutionary fashion. However, we will reveal nothing of the process in this message. This show is a "must see". Join Paul and Michael at the Guild for the opening reception on Sunday, June 4th from 3:00- 5:00 PM. Their exhibit, titled <u>1-kôr</u>, will be on display in our gallery from June 3 – June 28, with a closing reception on Sunday, June 25th, from 3:00- 5:00 PM. Mark your calendar as this exhibit will be impressive and unique.

Just a reminder, Associate and Exhibiting Members may submit works for the monthly Lobby Show as always. Receiving is on June 1st from noon until 7:00. Pick up will take place on June 29th.

This summer, the **Catalyst Academy** at the Guild will offer programs for children from age 6 through high school. **Pint Size Picassos** is a class for students age 6 through 12, and provides an exploration of drawing, painting, and more. **Portfolio Prep** is a series of classes for students in grades 7 through 12, and will offer the opportunity to create and explore original art in a variety of mediums. Students in this class will learn the fundamentals of creating a portfolio for admission into a high school or college art program. Both of these classes will take place in July. More information is available in this Bulletin.

New instructional workshops are in development, class rosters are increasing, and we have a new teacher for the fall. The Guild's instructional component offers top teachers working in our completely renovated studio. The Guild is truly an ideal location to foster the growth of the artist in you.

One final note: We have always utilized images of our members' art to promote exhibits where their work appears. These images are used to promote the Guild as well. We remind everyone that by submitting artwork or images of artwork to us, you grant permission for us to use those images in our Bulletin and in promotions to publicize both the artist and the Guild. Art enriches, art heals, art educates.












