

The **Paul Hansen** and **Mike Indorato** exhibit, $\underline{\mathbf{I}-\mathbf{k}\hat{\mathbf{O}}\mathbf{r}}$, that was on display in our gallery this past June, was notable in many respects. 85% of the 140 works of art in the show were collaborative efforts by Paul and Mike. To our knowledge, our gallery has never housed so many joint works in one show. Paul and Mike wanted to make their paintings and mixed medium works affordable, and that strategy paid off. Thirty-eight works sold, which also seems like a Guild record for one show. Congratulations to Paul and Mike.

Our July exhibit is the **Summer Show of Painters.** The 62 works submitted for this show were diverse in medium and style, technically strong, and offered abundant originality with a variety of provocative messages. Exhibits by our Guild members are constantly amazing because each new show proves the vast amount of talent our members possess.

The reception for our July show attracted 110 people. The **Guild of Creative Art - James T. Gary Scholarship** was presented to this year's winner, **Evelyn Kunycky**, a senior from Wall High School in Monmouth County who will pursue an art career at Pratt this fall. She and her family were so proud of Evelyn and her achievements. Evelyn's artwork appears in this bulletin, and is on display in our gallery through August 2nd.

Next up: Our **Guild Exhibiting Members' All Media – No Theme Show**. Receiving is Thursday, August 3rd, from noon until 7:00 PM. Guild Exhibiting Member Shows are always a visual feast, and this year's show will be on display in our Main Gallery from August 5th through August 30th. The reception for the Exhibiting Members' Show is scheduled for Sunday, August 6th, from 3:00 until 5:00. After show pick up is on Thursday, August 31st from noon until 7:00 PM

The Prospectus for our **31st Annual Open Juried Show** is now on our website. Over \$2000 in prize monies will be awarded to talented artists in painting, sculpture, and photography. The submission period is from **July 21st until August 21st**. Entrees may only be submitted online, and no entries will be accepted before or after those dates. Click <u>HERE</u> for more information, the Prospectus, and the online registration form. The show runs from September 30th – November 1st.

Playwrights Speak, an annual Guild event where actors write and perform a short play developed with inspiration from a piece of artwork in the OJ Show, unfortunately, will not be able to perform for us on October 29th as our Exhibition Schedule postcards state. As we are often reminded, sometimes life gets in the way of the best laid plans. We look forward to next year, and their return.

Art in Bloom, an exhibit by floral designers who will choose a work on display in our OJ Show and create a living, floral sculpture, will exhibit in our Main Gallery from October 14th to October 17th. Remarkable arrays of floral designs incorporating the palate of the chosen work provide immense entertainment for the viewer. Come to their reception on Sunday, October 15th from 2:00 – 4:00 PM. You will be amazed at how these talented floral artists fashion their works.

With a deep sadness in our hearts, we must announce the passing of Guido Guazzoni on June 22, 2023. Guido was a long-time Exhibiting member of the Guild, and a frequent exhibitor of his artwork. His oil painting style was unique and easily recognizable.

Guido was born in Milano, Italy, into a family of artists. Although art was his passion, Guido did not pursue it as a course of study. He studied Physics in college and attained a PhD. For the next forty-five years he focused on a career in research and development in the field of energy conversion and power generation.

After retiring in 2003, Guido fully committed to his oil painting. Since then he began exhibiting at the Guild of Creative Art, as well as many venues in the area, including the Monmouth Arts Council, Belmar Arts and more. Guido was the well deserved recipient of many awards for his artwork.
























Low Mileage, One Owner by Robert Stetz - Watercolor






