The Guild's 31st Annual Open Juried Show will soon be coming to a close. It has been a visually striking exhibit coupled with lots of heart. Our judges, Gina Torello for painting and sculpture, and Phil Echo for photography, pared down approximately 230 submissions to around 100 entries for exhibit in the show. The range of style and theme is impressively wide and all embracing. Technique, composition, originality and messages were in abundance. The artists whose work was accepted into the show were honored to be among such distinguished company and extraordinary artwork. While the Annual Open Juried Show has always been impressive, this was one of our best shows ever.

The Open Juried Show reception was attended by more than 150 people anxiously awaiting the presentation of \$2400 in award monies and 10 bronze Achievement Awards. With more than thirty awards to be announced, the suspense was palpable. 85% of the prize money was, in fact, donated in memory of lost loved ones, so the reception took on added meaning. Those in attendance experienced many touching moments as donors offered a few words about the person who was being memorialized. We congratulate the winners as well as those who were accepted into the show, and we thank all of the artists who entered.

Art in Bloom added a delightful live dimension to the Open Juried Show. Seven floral designers contributed to the Art in Bloom exhibit. Each designer selected one piece of artwork from the Open Juried Show as inspiration for creating a floral arrangement. The designs were remarkable, capturing the lines, shapes, colors, and mood of the artwork.

Each month the Guild also displays in our lobby an exhibit of artwork by our Exhibiting and Associate Members. Guild members receive greater exhibiting opportunities as an Associate or Exhibiting member, and being able to show works in the lobby every month is a nice perk, indeed. The lobby is the first space one experiences upon entering the Guild. We are pleased to surround visitors with great art the moment they cross the threshold.

Our Semi-annual Portfolio Review gives Guild General Members and Associate Members the opportunity to upgrade their membership status and expand their exhibiting privileges. Portfolio Review also gives valuable feedback from a panel of accomplished judges. Next up: Christopher MacKinnon and Mike Quon present a two-person show which will be on display from November 4th to November 29th. The reception is on Sunday, November 5th, from 3:00- 5:00 PM. Mike and Christopher will show artwork of various mediums that they produced over the past 30 years.

Annual All Member Holiday Show

This year's All Member Show in our Main Gallery will receive artwork on <u>November 30th</u>. *Receiving opens at noon and closes promptly at 7:00 pm. No work will be accepted before or after that date and those times.* Click <u>HERE</u> for Show Submission Forms to expedite your registration process. All Guild members whose dues are paid in full for the current year may enter one or two works no longer than 48 inches on any side. The entry fee is \$5.00 per piece. The show will run through December. <u>The Guild will retain a 33.3% commission on all sales.</u>

Exhibiting & Associate Member Lobby Show

Our lobby will feature artwork by the **Guild's Exhibiting Members** and small treasures, no longer than 14 inches on a side, by the **Guild's Associate Members**. To exhibit artwork, dues must be paid in full for the current year. A donation of \$5.00 is requested for each work displayed. Receiving and End-of-Show Pickup will coincide with the Gallery Show. <u>The Guild will retain a 33.3% commission on all sales.</u>

Cash and Carry Miniature Show

The walls of the Guild Studio will feature small objects of art sized <u>no greater than 14 inches on any side, and priced</u> <u>under \$100</u>. Display space for the Miniature Show is available to all **Guild Exhibiting and Associate Members** whose dues are paid in full for the current year. Receiving for the Cash and Carry Miniature Show is concurrent with receiving for the All Member Holiday Show. There is no entry fee for the Miniature Show in the studio. The artwork will be on display for eager shoppers throughout December. <u>Pre-register your artwork</u> to reserve wall space and to allow time for tags to be produced. Entries for the Miniature Show must be priced at \$100 or less. <u>Pre-registration ends on receiving day for the December show</u>. Due to wall space restrictions, the total number of entries and/or number per artist may be limited. Gina Torello earned her M.F.A in Florence, Italy from the Dominican University in Chicago Illinois. She taught at Boardman Studios, an undergraduate Academy in Florence, Italy.

Gina is an active Board of Trustee Member on the Monmouth Arts Organization here in Monmouth County, and an Adjunct Professor at Monmouth University. She teaches at many local art institutions in our county, including the Guild of Creative Art.

Gina's fine arts class, **Painting the Human Form**, will be held on Friday mornings from 10:00-12:00. This course is designed to guide each student in painting the human form in oils, but students may utilize their favorite medium, such as acrylics or pastels. Students will strengthen their anatomical drawing skills and their understanding of how light wraps around the human figure.

Students will experience the enjoyable and fulfilling process of creating beautiful and unique works of art. Students can expect to complete one painting a week, rotating their position in the classroom throughout the four weeks in order to capture various perspectives of the model. All artistic and ability levels are welcomed into this course. Individual artists will be instructed at their stage of experience. Bring your favorite supplies, as this course welcomes oils, acrylics and pastels.

Students will supply their own materials. Minimum canvas size is 20"x16". Gina will be instructing in oils, however, if you prefer working in pastels or acrylic, please bring all materials for the medium you choose.

A <u>cash-only</u> model fee for all four class sessions will be collected on the first day of the first class.



Best of Show in Painting Lori Weisenfeld for *Shirley* – Pastel



Judge's Comment: Such a great capture of a woman that age; the hands, the body, and the face. We see a lifetime of experience as well as the effects of the body aging. We feel it too. The artist is a master of the pastel medium, with excellent choices in the use of shadow, light and tone.

Best of Show in Sculpture Duncan Culver for *9 Windles* – Metal



Judge's Comment: I appreciate the precision, craftsmanship, and fluid design of a kinetic piece with which the viewer can interact. It demonstrates the mastery of the mechanics of display, and it is fun too!

Mitchell Award for Acrylic Val Dyshlov for *Girl with Guitar*



Judge's Comment: With its total liberation of color, this artist pays homage to the Fauvists, but there is a bit of Matisse here, and perhaps, Cezanne too. It displays an interesting juxtaposition of the brightly colored woman seen from the front, and the profile of the man in the darkness, with both heads inside a frame. Movement and energy are in abundance, and the organic pieces pull you in.

Friedlander Award for Abstract Donald Robinson for *Inside the Studio*



Judge's Comment: I love the shapes and spaces because they create an exciting sense of movement. The red moves my eye from foreground to figure, and all of the color choices are excellent. The artist abstracts the reality from this working space forcefully and with whimsy. The shape of the work is unusually long and narrow; a difficult shape for many artists.

Lorraine Ravner Award for Artistic Innovation in Photography Cheryl Bomba for I Hold with Those Who Favor Fire



Judge's Comment: I love the abstract organization of the elements and the strong horizontals and verticals. The use of negative space and those horizontals and verticals create a certain balance, and the painterly colorful quality of the red hydrant and surrounding ice were excellent decisions.

Bill Machinsky Memorial Award for Landscape Photography Jim Powers for *Heather on the Henge*



Judge's Comment: I love the point of view, which allows the viewer's eyes to focus on the vegatation, filling up two thirds of the composition. The nuances of color, texture and light are wonderful. Those vertical monoliths piercing the sky form a perfect transition from land to sky. It is a grand vision.

Caivano Memorial Award for Oil Arthur Andersen for *Woman Portrait*



Judge's Comment: This artist's use of color and color mixing is phenominal. Light is captured so well. She seems like an iconic figure; a statement of the power and rights of all women.

David MacNeil Memorial Award for "Make 'em Laugh"

Thomas Camal for Moonstruck in South Dakota



Judge's Coment: The cleverness of this photo brings a smile to my face. The arrow points to the moon as my eye travels down to the MOONSHINE sign. An excellent composition. I love the diagonal angle of the vehicles and the separation between them.

Tom Wilczewski Memorial Award for Watercolor Jackie St. Angel for *tude*






Barbara Shieldkret Memorial Award for Mixed Media

Yolanda Fleming for Poder de la Flor



Judge's Comment: There is so much to love here: an excellent composition, the energy, the layers, fabric, and the powerful imagery (which tasks the viewer to establish a range of meanings), are combined in a delightful mix. This artist is fearless!





Judge's Comment: The colors, forms, lines, textures and layers work so well. The artist has used oils with a knowledge of both impasto and transparency. I feel its power and energy while relishing its looks.

Sarah Stern Memorial Award for Artistic Innovation in Painting Paul Qian for Memory of Vernazza



Judge's Comment: How the artist uses light and color, including the choices of color, are not traditional. The light and the textures create both a compositional tension and and a sense of unity in a unique and powerful fashion. A striking image.

Frank Colaguori Memorial Award for Realism in Painting Michael Scherfen for Afghan Pashtun Tribesman



Judge's Comment: Here is a master in the art of watercolor, reaching the heights of realism. In spite of a limited palette (primarily orange and brown), the artist has captured both the physiognomy of the subject and the inner life as well. His use of color, texture, light, value, and tone are excellent.

Michelina Delucia Memerial Award for Bird Photography

Janet Simon for *Peacock*



Judge's Comment: Excellent point of view. The arrangement of the display brings you right to the focal point. A good separtation of elements. Soft lighting tones it down perfectly. It seems to know if the bird is engaging us.

Pastelist Salon of New Jersey Award in Memory of Caroline Klein Pat Hutchinson for Soda



Judge's Comment: A great composition and use of color and light. The position of the body and head adds to a vision of a brave, perhaps quirky personality. I love the unfinished portion. Her bold attitude reflects the attitude of the artist!

Bob O'Keefe Memorial Award for Technical Brilliance Bill Ross for Vanitas



Judge's Comment: The artist's theme harkens back to the 17th century and earlier. Life is transitory and we are reminded of that, the phases of life, and our own mortality. Other images provoke us further. The artist's use of light and shadow, texture and the full range of value shows an artist as a master in academic skills of fdrawing combined with an imaginative originality.

Goldstein Family Award for People in Photography John Mottola for *Future Artist*



Judges Comment: An excellent composition. I love the separation of elements and how the black edge stops your eye. The point of view was a good decision too. The juxtaposition of the masters on the wall and the budding artist so focused on her art creates a delightful story.

Jean Watson Parmly Memorial Award for Portraiture Richard Huff for *Stephanie* – Photography



Judge's Comment: I love the choice of white for the background, an excellent use of negative space. The slight twist of the body allows for a wonderful contrast of light and dark. The gaze, the position of mouth and hands give her an attitude. We are in her World.

Mark Behr Memorial Award for Action in Photography


Elina Veyberman for Runner




