
<u>In Memoriam</u>

Santo Pezzutti passed away recently at the age of 101 ½. Born June 2, 1922, Santo was a respected patriarch of the art community. He has been an Exhibiting member of the Guild of Creative Art for more than 50 years, with his last exhibit on display at the Guild in November of 2021. His work is powerful, utilizing brilliant color, strong compositions, and energetic brushwork.

Santo once explained, "I paint what moves me. I'm excited to find the simple shapes in a composition and bring them forth in importance. Then all the other elements fall into place. Once I start a painting, it flows with a life of its own. I never strive for photographic realism, but instead respect the nature of the medium within the dictates of design, color, and texture". His work has been published in numerous art magazines, and has been shown in countless exhibits, both local and national, winning many distinguished awards.

Santo's daughter, Carol Lenehan stated, "(Santo) lived a beautiful life and always felt that he was a very lucky man! You can't ask for more than that."

Santo Pezzutti was an inspiration to everyone who knew him, and he will be greatly missed. The Guild offers condolences to Santo's family and friends.

Gina Torello Winter Session

Anatomical Drawing of the Nude Form

Fridays, 10:00 AM – 1:00 PM 4 classes: February 16 to March 8



Anatomical Drawing of the Nude Form is a weekly, three hour, structured course in life drawing and anatomy. Students will learn the human figure's infrastructure using a life size skeleton and a live model. Several classical methods will be covered to build the student's confidence in drawing the human figure anatomically correct and in proportion.

Proportion exercises and varied techniques will help students capture the subtle nuances necessary to create volume and dimension within the human form. Students will learn how to use diverse drawing materials such as charcoals, conte pencils, and pastel tonal sticks. Watercolor dyes and inks will introduce the use of the brush to transition the student into painting.

Students will experience the enjoyable and fulfilling process of creating beautiful and unique works of art, and expect to complete several drawings each week. All artistic and ability levels are welcomed. Individual artists will be instructed at their stage of experience.

Students will supply their own materials:

Drawing supplies 18"x24" newsprint pad 18"x24" Strathmore 400 Series white paper pad, soft vine charcoal General Pencil Multi Pastel Compressed Chalk Sticks 4/Pkg-Grey Tones or skin tone Conte or pastel pencils or pastel sticks in loud colors Kneaded Eraser Any other drawing materials you feel comfortable working in during the length of the course.

Note: A cash-only model fee for all four class sessions will be collected on the first day of the first class. There will be new models each week.

Gina Torello earned her M.F.A in Florence, Italy from the Dominican University in Chicago Illinois. She taught at Boardman Studios, an undergraduate Academy in Florence, Italy.

Gina is an active Board of Trustee Member of the Monmouth Arts Organization here in Monmouth County, and an Adjunct Professor at Monmouth University. She teaches at many local art institutions in our county, including the Guild of Creative Art.

Gina Torello Spring Session Painting the Human Form Fridays: 10:00 AM – 1:00 PM 4 classes: March 22 to April 12



Painting the Human Form is a weekly, three hour class designed to teach the anatomy of the human form, strengthen anatomical drawing skills, and demonstrate how light wraps around the human figure of a live model. Students will learn the foundational importance of studying monochromatic values in transitioning to color tones, color harmony and color mixing.

This class will be fun and fulfilling as students create beautiful and unique works of art that represent their individuality. Students will develop their observation skills by careful study of the dimensions of the human form and figure.

Each week, students will create a beautiful and unique work of art that represents their individuality. Students will rotate positions in the classroom each week to capture various perspectives of the model. All artistic levels and skill sets are welcomed into this course as each artist will be instructed at their level of experience. Models will sit for two consecutive weeks.

Note: A cash-only model fee for all four class sessions will be collected on the first day of the first class. There will be a new model every two weeks.

Students will supply their own materials. Minimum size of canvas, paper, or board 20"x16" Gina will be instructing in several mediums, oils, pastels, acrylics, and inks Students are to bring all materials for the medium they choose.

Color Theory - Color Matching A Voyage into Color

Two 2 hour Sessions

Friday, March 8, 2024, 3:00 – 5:00 and Friday, March 15, 2024, 3:00 – 5:00

Tuition: \$30 for both sessions

Presenter: Patrick Dorgan

Patrick Dorgan spent 25 years instructing color matching for industrial applications, helping people understand color using the Munsell Color System. He studied at New Jersey City University and the Art Student League School of Visual Arts in New York City. This two-part workshop will begin with a discussion about color theory, and the importance of color matching for artists, designers, and manufacturers, as well, as introducing the three dimensions of color in the Munsell Color System. Students will experience hands-on exercises, training to see color variances in hue, chroma, and intensity, and the practical uses of color matching in overcoming challenges and limitations in everyday life. Time will also be devoted to question and answers, and discussion of insights and experiences.

The cost for the full four hours is \$30, and includes any materials needed. The course objective is for students to develop an understanding of color technology, color theory, and color matching that can be of valuable application to artists.

Beginner Pastels with Carole Rogers



8 sessions, January 24 through Wednesday, March 13, 2024 Wednesdays, 2:00 – 4:00 Instructor: Carole Rogers Tuition: Guild Member \$240, Non-Member \$270


This beginner pastel class is designed to teach the fundamentals of working with the pastel medium. Basic drawing skills are helpful. Students will learn about the range of pastel sticks, and which ones are best to use at different stages of painting. Experimentation with varied painting surfaces will help you cultivate your own preferences, and allow you to develop advanced skills when working with this medium. Learning how to mount and protect your paintings from smudging and damage will be covered as well. You will explore and practice blending, mark-making techniques, layering to achieve luminosity and dimension, and underpainting techniques with alcohol and watercolor. Students will have the choice to work from their own reference photo or from the still life set up in the studio. Carole can also provide a reference photo for you. There will be a short demo during each class as well as individual instruction to each student.

Carole Rogers graduated from NYU. As a self-taught artist, she painted in oils, exploring realism, pointillism, and impressionism. In 2010 while living abroad, she began studying portraiture with atelier-trained artist Kathy Barker in London, reigniting her passion for painting. She has taken pastel workshops with Margaret Dyer, Julie Friedman, Richard McKinley, Barbara Jaenicke, Casey Klahn, and Danielle Mick.

Carole is an exhibiting member of The Guild of Creative Art, the Pastel Society of America, the Pastel Society of New Jersey, the Degas Pastel Society, the Connecticut Pastel Society, the Pastel Society of Maine, the Catharine Lorillard Wolfe Art Club, the National Association of Women Artists, Monmouth Arts, and the Art Society of Monmouth County. She currently serves as Exhibitions Co-chair for the Pastel Society of New Jersey. Her award-winning work has been exhibited both nationally and internationally.




Above: Gingerbread House by Michele Rath - Watercolor

Below: Poinsettias by MaryAnn Goodwin – Watercolor














