As I write this message, the two-person exhibit by Lorraine Dey and Patricia Zilinski is coming to a close. This show is a delightful pairing of two talented and award winning artists. At first glance, the viewer notices the commonalities that exist in the subjects themselves: water, sky, and clouds. But upon greater reflection, the different approaches and mediums are noteworthy to this viewer. One thing is certain: both are supreme colorists. What a talented duo!

Next up in our Main Gallery is the Summer Show of Painters, on display from June 28 to July 30. The reception is on Sunday, June 29th from 3:00 until 5:00. This exhibit, open to all Guild members using a painting medium, is traditionally a very strong one.

Keep in mind that our Lobby Show changes monthly as well. Exhibiting there is one of the perks for those who have elevated their membership status to Associate or Exhibiting through our Semi-annual Portfolio Review which occurs in November and May.

Although we usually save our Studio Gallery exhibiting space for artwork by students in our classes, this July and August we will feature the *Art of Guild Legends*, some samples of which appear below. In July and August, we will exhibit the work of these artists in our studio, then, we will make their art available for purchase through a silent auction that extends through August. The monies raised by the sales of these pieces will help to provide the funding we seek for a documentary about the history of the Guild by award winning film maker, Erin Fleming.

So grab a piece of Guild history and help us share the history of our nonprofit organization. There are stories here that must be told. We salute the Guild's History Committee for all the work that has been done to prepare both a book devoted to Guild history, and the framework for the documentary soon to begin. Thank you to Vicky Culver, Mary Polese, Suzanne Parmly, and Natalie Kadash for your dedication and efforts.

Membership and classes are two important sources of income that help us to pay our constantly increasing bills. At the end of last year, we had close to 400 members. Megan Gilhool will present one-day classes on Pour Painting on July 17 and again on July 29 from 6:30 – 8:30 PM. Her July 22 class is sold out! 









Sunrise Dance by Patricia Zilinski – Oil









Above: Gulf Sunset by Patricia Zilinski – Oil Below: Road to the Clouds by Lorraine Dey – Acrylic











Contrails by Patricia Zilinski – Oil





Lebanon Historical Museum by Lorraine Dey – Acrylic



Storm over Sangre de Cristos by Patricia Zilinski – Oil






















Above: *Long Sunset* by Patricia Zilinski – Oil Below: Belmar Sunset by Lorraine Dey – Acrylic






Above: Catamaran Dreams by Patricia Zilinski








