

## President's Message

We have all heard the expression "Less is more." It could be argued that our Summer Show of Painters exhibit is a perfect example. Why? With only forty-eight paintings on the gallery walls, this is always one of our smallest shows. But because the show is small, we were able to stage the show so that the gallery presented only one horizontal row of work with ample breathing space between each piece.

I often joke that with our typical two rows of artwork, half the artists are upset that their works are placed too high; the other half are disturbed because their art is placed too low. This is not so with the Summer Show of Painters. The Summer Show of Painters exhibit remains in our Main Gallery through July 30<sup>th</sup>.

Next up: Our Exhibiting Members' All Media No-Theme Show. This exhibit will be on display in our Gallery August 2<sup>nd</sup> through August 20<sup>th</sup>, with a reception on Sunday, August 3<sup>rd</sup> from 3:00 to 5:00 PM. This exhibit celebrates those who have participated in our Semi-Annual Portfolio Review, and reached the highest level of Guild membership. Keep in mind that each Portfolio Review requires artists to bring in five pieces of their artwork to be evaluated by a Jury of artists. The next Portfolio Jury will take place on Thursday, November 13<sup>th</sup>. Receiving is by appointment only. Judging will take place on Friday, November 14<sup>th</sup>, and pick-up will be Saturday, November 15<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 until 3:00 PM. Would you like to teach a class, have a solo show, or exhibit off-site with the Guild's elite artists? The Portfolio Jury puts you on the path. For more information about the portfolio Jury process, click HERE and scroll down to the bottom of the Home page on our website.

I am constantly reminding readers about the health and vitality of the Guild. Cases in point: our membership continues to rise (we are at about 350 members), and class sizes are growing. Exhibiting member, Megan Heath Gilhool, just completed her first Pour Painting workshop and two more are to follow. Award winning filmmaker, Erin Fleming is in the process of creating a Guild documentary that will showcase just how special we are.

To help to defray the costs of the documentary, our History Committee will stage a silent auction of works created by "Guild Legends" throughout the month of August. I will announce this during our reception on Sunday, August 3<sup>rd</sup>. Stop by the Guild and make a bid on a piece of art from a legendary Guild member, such as Yvonne Aubert, Roberta Carter Clark, Donald Voorhees, Frank Colaguori, Doris Crandall, Robert O'Keefe, Caroline Klein, Leonia Mroczkowski, Eleanor Dreskin, and more.

On August 3<sup>rd</sup>, we will also honor our Guild Scholarship winner, Marisa Amitie from Wall Township High School, who will be in attendance to receive her award and her check. Every year we partner with the James T. Gary Foundation and provide \$1000 to a high school senior in Monmouth or Ocean County who is pursuing a career in Art. Of the fourteen applicants, the artwork of Marisa rose to the top. Let it be known that the grades, artistic statements, and teachers' recommendations of each student were stellar, so choosing the best was both inspiring and difficult. Congratulations, Marissa.

Please consider bidding on our "Guild Legends" display and donating to our Guild Scholarship Fund. Doing so will foster the creation of a documentary showcasing the Guild's illustrious past, and also ensure the continuation of scholarship winners in the future.

Finally, take note that the submission period for our All Media Open Juried Show has begun and will extend until August 29<sup>th</sup>. The Open Juried Show is our premier exhibit of the year. With over \$2000 in award money and ten Medals of Achievement, this is an exhibit that will pack the gallery (two rows at least)!


## The Art of Guild Legends

Members of the Guild History Committee will be available to answer questions from people who wish to view the artwork. They will be present on the following dates:




## **Member News**








