

President's Message

As I write this, James Kent, the leader of our Lyrical Abstraction class, is staging and hanging the "Abstract Conversations" show by himself. Eleven artists are part of this exhibit, and it is sure to be a blockbuster. James owned a gallery for over a decade, so he is used to doing this solo.

I chuckle when people remark that abstract art is easy to do, as it is anything but. Come see how professionals like this group can transport the viewer into different realms through line, shape, color, texture, value, form and space. The exhibit will run from Saturday, August 23^{rd} until Wednesday, September 17^{th} with a reception on Sunday, September 7^{th} from 3:00-5:00 PM.

Next up will be our 33rd Annual Open Juried Show. With over \$2000 in medals and award monies, and ten Medals of Achievement, this remains our most popular show. Our esteemed judges, Nancy Ori and Elisa Elorza, will have the difficult job of paring down 300+ submissions into about 100 acceptances, before they even decide on the awards. The submission period ends on August 29th, and this stellar exhibit can be seen from September 20th to October 29th, with a reception on Sunday, September 21st from 3:00 – 5:00 PM.

Keep in mind that every gallery show is accompanied by an Exhibiting and Associate Member Lobby show. As these works are the first that any visitor sees at the Guild, that first impression is always a powerful one. So much talent!

Art in Bloom, an exhibit in which floral designers choose a work from our Open Juried Show and create a living sculpture inspired by that work will be held again this year, from October 18^{th} through the 21^{st} . A reception for Art In Bloom will take place on Sunday, October 19^{th} from 2:00-4:00 PM. The merging of these two mediums is always delightfully different. Come see for yourself. The viewing time is limited as these floral designs are perishable.

We continue our effort to raise money for the documentary being produced by award winning filmmaker, Erin Fleming, highlighting the illustrious history of the Guild of Creative Art. We are currently conducting a silent auction to purchase artwork from some Guild Legends, not only to aid in this cause, but to give everyone a chance to own a treasured piece from a cherished member of the Guild's past. People will have their final chance to acquire art from Guild Legends during the reception of *Abstract Conversations* on September 7th. Do yourself a favor and bid on a piece of Guild history. The Guild is proud to offer quality original art at affordable prices. This silent auction allows you to obtain a relic from a Guild legend, while supporting the documentation of the Guild's history, truly a win-win.

Autumn is just around the corner, and with it comes Paul Hansen with another fabulous show. Paul will be exhibiting in our main gallery from November $\mathbf{1}^{st}$ to December $\mathbf{3}^{rd}$. Stay tuned for details.

Lastly, the opportunity to achieve Associate or Exhibiting member status will occur this November in our semi-annual Portfolio Review. Applications can be obtained on our website, or click HERE and scroll down to the bottom of the page to receive more information and an online application. The Portfolio Review happens twice a year, so do not delay.






