

President's Message

Our 33rd Annual Open Juried Show is in full swing. The reception on September 21st was noteworthy for so many reasons. Over 200 people attended. Not only did we announce the \$2200 in money awards plus ten Medals of Achievement, but those who donated toward memorial medals were given a chance to speak about the loved ones they lost. There were many touching moments.

Additionally, award winning documentarian, Erin Fleming, filmed the reception and awards ceremony. Erin has begun work on a documentary about the Guild, about which we are very excited.

The Open Juried Show was the most selective show ever. Of the 333 submitted works, only 100 were accepted into the show. Our esteemed judges, Elisa Elorza (painting and sculpture), and Nancy Ori (photography), put together as good an exhibit as anyone could remember. As always, there was a shared joy and pride for simply being accepted into the show. Keep in mind that this marvelous exhibit can be viewed through October 29th.

We celebrate "Art in Bloom," an exhibit within an exhibit. Independent floral designers will choose one of the pieces in the Open Juried Show as inspiration for a living sculpture they will create. The reception for "Art in Bloom" will be Sunday, October 19th from 2:00 - 4:00 PM. As the show will feature both living and cut flowers and plants, its run is a short one. "Art in Bloom" comes down October 21st. So, make sure to come while the exhibit is still blooming!

November brings two more exhibits to savor: Our Exhibiting and Associate Member Lobby Show, and the solo exhibit in our Main Gallery by Paul Hansen: "Three-Sided Box." Paul puts together a blockbuster show each year, and will no doubt delight us again this year. In addition, a film will be shown at 3:30 as part of Paul's show. Two receptions will be offered: The Opening Reception on Sunday, November 2nd, from 3:00-5:30 PM, and the Closing Reception on Sunday, November 30th, from 3:00-5:30 PM.

November also features our Semi-Annual Portfolio Review. Do you want to elevate your membership to garner more exhibiting privileges? Do you want to teach a class or have a solo show? Do you want to exhibit off site? These possibilities exist by participating in the Portfolio Review. Plus, you will receive an explicit and constructive critique of your work by members of our jury. Receiving is by appointment only on Thursday, November 14th, from noon through 3:45 PM. So, call the Guild now to set up an appointment to bring in five works in the same medium. Judging will take place on Friday, and pick-up is on Saturday, November 15th from 10:00 to 3:00 PM. More details are available on the Guild website. The Guild will retain a 20% commission on all sales.

Annual All Member Holiday Show

This year's All Member Show in our Main Gallery will receive artwork on <u>December 4th</u>. *Receiving opens at noon and closes promptly at 7:00 pm. No work will be accepted before or after that date and those times.* Click <u>HERE</u> for Show Submission Forms to expedite your registration process. All Guild members whose dues are paid in full for the current year may enter one or two works no longer than 48 inches on any side. The entry fee is \$5.00 per piece. The show will run through December. <u>The Guild will retain a 33.3% commission on all sales.</u> Send a jpg of your display pieces to <u>guildofcreativeart@verizon.net</u> and have your artwork appear in our bulletin. After show pick up takes place on Thursday, <u>January 8, 2026</u>, noon – 7:00 PM.

Exhibiting & Associate Member Lobby Show

Our lobby will feature artwork by the **Guild's Exhibiting Members** and small treasures, no longer than 14 inches on a side, by the **Guild's Associate Members**. To exhibit artwork, dues must be paid in full for the current year. A donation of \$5.00 is requested for each work displayed. Receiving and End-of-Show Pickup will coincide with the Gallery Show. The Guild will retain a 33.3% commission on all sales.

Cash and Carry Miniature Show

The walls of the Guild Studio will feature small objects of art sized no greater than 14 inches on any side, and priced under \$100. Display space for the Miniature Show is available to all Guild Exhibiting and Associate Members whose dues are paid in full for the current year. Receiving for the Cash and Carry Miniature Show is concurrent with receiving for the All Member Holiday Show. There is no entry fee for the Miniature Show in the studio. The artwork will be on display for eager shoppers throughout December. Pre-register your artwork to reserve wall space and to allow time for tags to be produced. Click HERE for Show Submission Forms to expedite your registration process. Entries for the Miniature Show must be priced at \$100 or less. Pre-registration ends on receiving day for the December show. Due to wall space restrictions, the total number of entries and/or number per artist may be limited.






