

President's Message

With autumn in full swing at the time of this writing, we welcomed Paul Hansen back to the Guild for this year's incredible show. Paul showcases his story in a multi-media production titled *Three Sided Box*. Paul describes the show as a stage being a three sided box with the fourth wall conceptually separating the performers from the audience. His opening reception on November 2^{nd} featured a movie, which contained an album by Paul's band, both complementing the nine sixty inch by sixty inch mixed media artwork and 35+ more on display. Paul's exhibits are always spectacular, provocative and, most importantly, enjoyable. The closing reception is here at the Guild on Sunday, November 30^{th} , from 3:00-5:30. The film begins at 3:30. The show closes December 3^{rd} .

Next up for us, the holiday exhibit, party, and opening reception will take place on Sunday, December 7^{th} from 3:00-6:00. All Guild members are invited to enter artwork into the exhibit. All mediums are welcomed. Receiving is on December 4^{th} from noon until 7:00. Exhibiting and Associate Members may also hang work in our lobby show as well.

Preceding the reception, the Guild's annual meeting will take place at 2:30. The purpose of the annual meeting is to reflect upon the achievements of 2025, elect Board members for 2026, and set our sights on future goals.

Our Main Gallery will be filled with gift tables displaying artist-made artwork and fine crafts for sale. Also on hand will be bin racks with matted, but unframed, flat work for sale. This is original art by our Exhibiting and Associate member artists, the two top tiers of membership. Also for sale during December are miniature pieces of original art measuring no more than 14 inches on the longest side, and priced under \$100. Gift table items and miniatures are cash and carry, and make great gifts. The Holiday Exhibit and party should always be on one's "must see" list.

The New Year means it is, once again, time for our **EDGY** Show. This exhibit is open to all Guild members and non-members in all artistic mediums. Entries should be cutting edge, experimental, off-beat, or stylish, basically **EDGY**. Ribbons will be awarded. The Show runs from January 10th to January 28th with a reception on Sunday, January 11th from 3:00 – 5:00.

As we say goodbye to 2025, remember that all dues expire on December 31st each year. Please renew your membership as soon as possible to enjoy the full benefit of your membership category. Click <u>HERE</u> to renew easily on our website.

Speaking of membership, I offer my congratulations to the artists who entered the Portfolio Review in November in an effort to upgrade their membership status to Associate or Exhibiting. This is an opportunity to have your artwork judged by your peers to help you grow as an artist. This year we had a strong showing. Nineteen artists applied. Regardless of the outcome, we hope you benefitted from the experience. The Portfolio Review at the Guild happens twice a year. The next Portfolio Review will be in May.

Annual All Member Holiday Show

This year's All Member Show in our Main Gallery will receive artwork on <u>December 4th</u>. *Receiving opens at noon and closes promptly at 7:00 pm. No work will be accepted before or after that date and those times.* Click <u>HERE</u> for Show Submission Forms to expedite your registration process. All Guild members whose dues are paid in full for the current year may enter one or two works no longer than 48 inches on any side. The entry fee is \$10.00 for your first piece, \$5 for the second piece. The show will run through December. <u>The Guild will retain a 33.3% commission on all sales.</u> Send a jpg of your display pieces to <u>info@guildofcreativeart.org</u> and have your artwork appear in our bulletin.

Exhibiting & Associate Member Lobby Show

Our lobby will feature artwork by the **Guild's Exhibiting Members** and small treasures, no longer than 14 inches on any side, by the **Guild's Associate Members**. To exhibit artwork, dues must be paid in full for the current year. A donation of \$5.00 is requested for each work displayed. Receiving and End-of-Show Pickup will coincide with the Gallery Show. The Guild will retain a 33.3% commission on all sales.

Holiday Party Gift Tables

At this year's Holiday Party and Opening Reception, all Guild members whose dues are paid in full for this current year have the opportunity to sell items such as note cards, jewelry, pottery, scarves, fine crafts, and small portfolio pieces. All items for sale must be artist made. Sales are cash and carry. To display your work, you may bring a 4 x 4 foot table covering and use one of our tables, or bring your own table, no larger than 3 x 6 feet. There is no charge for table space. Space is limited, so reserve your spot today! E-mail the Guild at guildofcreativeart@verizon.net, or call Vicky at the Guild between noon and 3:00, Tuesdays through Fridays at 732-741-1441. The Guild will retain a 20% commission on all sales.

Cash and Carry Miniature Show

The walls of the Guild Studio will feature small objects of art sized no greater than 14 inches on any side, and priced under \$100. Display space for the Miniature Show is available to all Guild Exhibiting and Associate Members whose dues are paid in full for the current year. Receiving for the Cash and Carry Miniature Show is concurrent with receiving for the All Member Holiday Show. There is no entry fee for the Miniature Show in the studio. The artwork will be on display for eager shoppers throughout December. Pre-register your artwork to reserve wall space and to allow time for tags to be produced. Click HERE for Show Submission Forms to expedite your registration process. Entries for the Miniature Show must be priced at \$100 or less. Pre-registration ends on receiving day for the December show. Due to wall space restrictions, the total number of entries and/or number per artist may be limited. The Guild will retain a 20% commission on all sales.

Bin Racks

Guild Exhibiting and Associate Members whose dues are paid in full for the current year may bring in their own bin racks to display their flat work in the studio for the month of December. There is no price limitation on bin rack artwork, and these works are Cash and Carry. Space is limited for the Bin Rack display, so the number of bin racks will be limited. 



"Three Sided Box"

The real me is still hiding.


The task of this album is to chisel away bits and pieces of the barrier that separates us.


Life is a stage.














The Fourth Wall is Crumbling
















Three Sided Box is on display in our gallery until December 3rd.


